Today Romania is a democracy, a member of the European Union, and has perhaps the best internet access in the world. These changes have had significant impact on the entire country, but consider the significant impact that these social changes pose for Romania's evangelical church.

Few churches in history have been forced to adjust to such drastic social change. And, if they fail to adjust to the new cultural reality, or do so with theological compromise, the church could falter or fail.
